The Mission of Congress Park Neighbors, Inc. is to inform Congress Park residents of specific matters in or proposed for Congress Park (e.g. zoning issues, liquor licenses), City-wide initiatives (recycling, parking, crime, zoning code changes, etc.), and, when required, to represent Congress Park's position on selected matter before City agencies. We do this differently than most Registered Neighborhood Organizations in the City. We represent Congress Park not via unilateral board decisions, but the position is established based upon Neighborhood Assemblies and at these Neighborhood Assemblies we ensure those voting are, in fact residents, or property/business owners/manager with CPN's boundaries.
