This agreement recognizes the cooperative relationship between Denver Botanic Gardens and the surrounding neighborhoods as represented by the Neighborhood Advisory Committee. Commitments made in this agreement shall extend through December 31, 2025.

- The Gardens will host no more than 17 highly amplified events per year, no more than 14 of which will be concerts. Current examples of highly amplified events include concerts, Sabor and the Fete. The Gardens will continue to monitor the sound at these events and distribute reports to NAC contacts. Events that use minor sound effects or spoken word do not qualify as highly amplified. Current examples include Glow, Blossoms of Light and weddings.
- 2. The Gardens will continue to manage Blossoms of Light with timed tickets and a cap of no more than 4,000 per night. This number includes all group and private event tickets.
- 3. No new DBG ticketed evening events with attendance exceeding 1,250, inclusive of all ticket types, will be added without the agreement of a majority of the members of the Neighborhood Advisory Committee attending a NAC meeting where there is a quorum.
- 4. Any exception to this agreement during its term requires the consent of the Gardens and a majority of the members of the Neighborhood Advisory Committee attending a NAC meeting where there is a quorum.
