Proposed rules pertaining to the distance restriction between hotel and restaurant liquor licenses and schools

Purpose and Subject:

The Department of Excise and Licenses will conduct a public hearing on proposed rules concerning the hotel and restaurant liquor license under authority of Section 2.7.4 of the Charter of the City and County of Denver, and Section 12-47-313(1)(d)(III) of the Colorado Liquor Code. The proposed effective date of these rules is August 1, 2012. Pursuant to Article VI, Chapter 2 of the Denver Revised Municipal Code, notice is hereby given that the Director of the Department of Excise and Licenses is considering the adoption of proposed rules pertaining to the hotel and restaurant liquor license, eliminating the five hundred foot distance restriction between schools and hotel and restaurant licenses only. The distance restrictions with respect to all other classes of liquor licenses, including taverns and liquor stores, will not change.
